1. Meeting Minutes

3. Informational Items

Syllabi, Office Hours, and Trainings

- Chairs will receive messages for collecting syllabi; Dropbox request link in use (faculty can upload without seeing others' files).
- Faculty should keep trainings current via CSU Learn; reminders will be sent.
- Office hours collection coordinated through program analysts.
- Travel: ongoing issues with Concur system; faculty asked for patience while problems are resolved.

ICE Information Cards

• "Know Your Rights" cards distributed at convocation; electronic and paper copies available through Dean's Office.

Move Updates

- TTF furniture delivered to Shasta and Marin; NTTF furniture orders still pending.
- Issues: non-locking doors, elevator malfunctions, misplaced ADA tables.
- Performing Arts moving into Bell Tower East; vacant offices in Solano under review.

- Commitment to ensuring NTTF have access to private or reservable offices for student consultations.
- Room issue reporting via QR code; Performing Arts equipment may be borrowed for events.

Summer Advising Workshops & Orientation Feedback

- Concerns raised regarding communication gaps, scheduling conflicts (e.g., Echo Fest overlap with Convocation), fees for orientation, t-shirt sizing/distribution, and required participation in learning communities for scholarship recipients.
- Chairs asked to complete feedback form; results will be summarized for the Provost.
- Broader concerns about advising being managed outside Academic Affairs;
 discussion of guided registration and its unintended impacts on student course pathways and time to degree.

4. Discussion Items

Enrollment Update

- Current FTES just under 3,500, exceeding the fall target of 3,236.
- Department-level breakdowns available on institutional dashboards.

Communication & Outreach

- Feedback requested on improving communication between Dean's Office, chairs, and faculty.
- Suggestions included: clearly identifying recipients in emails, biweekly digest emails, use of Canvas pages, and student newsletter models.
- Recognition of broader structural challenges due to staffing and workload.

5. Chair Items

• Events & Classroom Use: Concerns raised about external rentals (e.g., Malibu 100) where events staff moved or altered equipment and failed to restore spaces. Chairs emphasized need for accountability and timely resets.

- Alcohol on Campus: New policy allowing alcohol sales at Student Union noted.
- **Faculty Titles**: Ongoing inconsistencies in terminology (Lecturer vs. NTTF). CBA uses "temporary," while campus communications vary; clarification requested.
- Chess Donor: Advancement seeking faculty with interest in chess for donor engagement.
- Course Fees: Update expected in fall; funds must be spent by December.

6. Open Discussion

- Broader reflection on communication gaps, advising misalignments, and impact of structural changes on faculty workload.
- Emphasis on ensuring policy decisions (learning communities, guided registration, orientation fees) support rather than hinder student retention and timely graduation.
- Ideas for new communication tools included podcasts or spotlights on faculty research.
